- WINTER IS HERE -

Winter came a bit earlier than normal this year. We were not able to get all the leaves picked up; we normally do, but hopefully enough snow will clear that we can continue. Sadly, the early and quick snowfall caused some extensive tree damage around the Park. We are going to try our hardest to save the trees that were severely damaged. We know we sound like a broken record on some of these winter things (for the younger people, records were those black vinyl round disks that played music on turntables), but it is helpful for us all to be reminded and especially for the new residents to the Park.

Take note: 1) Please be sure your outside hose is disconnected. If it is not, it increases your chances of causing ice damage to your outside faucet. Remember that the faucet is your responsibility and the HOA will not repair it if it is broken. 2) Please do not park on the street if it is snowing. The plow needs to have clear running to be able get the snow off the streets. Remember that there is no overnight parking on the streets at anytime of the year from 12:00 to 6:00AM. 3) Do not put salt on any concrete surfaces. Use ice melt. We only use salt on the asphalt streets sparingly due to the damage it causes. 4) Ice melt is available from maintenance. Please use it around your walks for possible ice problem spots. Call 801-263-0822 if you need some. 5) Remember that on heavy snow days, it may take a while before your drive and walks get cleaned. Maintenance plows and shovels snow on a priority basis. Be patient, you will be taken care of. Snow removal does not normally begin unless there is an average of two (2) inches accumulation. 6) Be cautious as you move around the property. It is impossible to keep every surface clear of snow and ice 24 hours a day. There is a certain amount of personal responsibility that one must accept as they move about the property. 7) Even though it is winter and snow may cover the ground, it does not relieve pet owners of the responsibility to pick up after their animals immediately. Yellow snow is okay; brown and lumpy snow is not okay. 8) Now, go out and have some fun in the snow! Make a snowman and some snow angels. MERRY CHRISTMAS and HAPPY HOLIDAYS!!

— QUARTERLY SPECIAL ASSESSMENT —

The quarterly special assessment payment was due on December 1st, 2010. Your assessment fee balance as of the 1st should be no more than \$150. Assessment statements were mailed last month.

— From Finance and Management —

When making payments, please make sure your Barrington Park address appears somewhere on the check or money order. Your address is your account number and doing so helps ensure your payments get posted to the proper account. You do not need to write two separate checks for the regular and special HOA dues, unless you want to for your own accounting purposes. Anything above what your normal dues are will be applied to any special dues unless you indicate differently. Payments received are first applied to the regular HOA dues and then to any special dues. Regular HOA dues are due the 1st of the month, even if you do not get a statement until sometime later. A late charge of \$25 or 5% (whichever is greater) will be charged for any payment received after the 25th of the month.

Homeowners who are two (2) months in arrears as of the 25th of last month are listed as follows. Others that were on the list have since become current. Liens either have been or will be placed in these properties if they are not brought current immediately. (Accounts marked with an "M" are late on monthly dues, and those marked with an "A" are late on the special assessment.)
