In an attempt to keep the Barrington Park residents better informed of what is happening in the our community, this news letter is provided on a monthly basis. Please submit items at least 1 week before the end of the month.

Spring Around the Corner – As of this writing and looking at snow falling outside, it's pretty hard to believe spring is right around the corner. But it is and as the snow retreats and those ugly black piles disappear, there is just a hint of green starting to emerge. The maintenance crew is flip flopping between ice melt and spring clean up. Pretty soon the buds and bulbs will start emerging and the whole Park moves into a pretty exciting and wonderful season. As spring does approach, we thought it wise to remind everyone of a few things. First and foremost is safety - Those kids that have been cooped up all winter like to start playing out doors. We are terrified for their safety as we continue to observe cars going through this Park like it is the Indianapolis 500. Please slow down before someone gets hurt. Besides it's one of the rules you agreed to when you moved into the Park. **Flower gardens** – Homeowners should remember that you are responsible for the flower garden areas on the front of your homes and planted areas along the driveways. We encourage homeowners to add a bit of color to the Park by planting appropriately. If the Park is forced into weeding and taking care of your area, it will be back charged to the homeowner. They should be kept free of weeds and other debris. Concerning those flower bed areas, the Grounds Committee recommended and the Board decided that the wood used for retaining in the flower beds will no longer be acceptable. Instead, we have adopted a product called "Castle Rock". It is available from maintenance and comes in two sizes, 12"x 4" and 15" x 71/2". The delivered cost to you will be \$1.49 and \$3.24 respectively. Examples of these blocks can be seen at Whitby Court. For those of you that still have wood in your flowerbeds, don't go out and buy the block unless you are replacing the wood. The wood is Okay until it needs to be replaced. If you want to order the block, just let maintenance or the office know. Water – For those of you that have sump pumps, make sure they are operating. We have been informed that some pumps are now operating after having no requirements for the past 4 years. This shouldn't be a surprise with this years 100% snow pack and continued rains. As a reminder, your Association is not responsible for water damage caused by natural sources such as rain or snow. Rollerblades, Skates, Skateboards, Motorized Scooters, ATVs – As the weather warms, a friendly reminder that these items are not allowed to be used in the Park. Please help us keep the Park quiet and safe. **Tennis Courts** – Soon the net will be placed. If you want to use the tennis court and you do not have a key, you can get one from the office. It will cost you a \$5.00 refundable key deposit. **Dog and Cat mess** – Please keep it clean. Last month we issued five \$100.00 fines for dog and cat violations to include not cleaning up after pets and animals running loose. We are serious about this issue and are showing no tolerance for violations.

<u>Board of Director Offices and Committees</u> – The last page of this newsletter contains the Board of Directors and the offices they have been elected or appointed to. It also lists the different Committees and Chairpersons of those committees. We are soliciting participation by homeowners who wish to serve on any of these committees. If you see a committee that interests you and you are willing to put in just a few hours a year to help, let either the chairperson know or drop a note in the office drop box. The more people that get involved, the better the Park becomes. Please get involved in <u>your community</u>.

<u>Volunteer of the Month</u> – This month we want to recognize **Deloris Lenhart**. Our property manager took on the task of cleaning out 25 years worth of old financial records that are no longer needed by the Park. Mixed in these files were some items of historical value and correspondence. Deloris graciously volunteered to help go through the files and separate those items that were considered to have some sort of historical value. She spent many hours working under some pretty dusty and dirty circumstances. The end result, the old stuff is gone and we are up to date with our records. Many of you know Deloris from her many years of service to Barrington as a member of the Board. Even though she is not on the Board now, she still wants and does contribute a great deal for the benefit of everyone who lives in this community. Deloris, thanks so much for all you do.

<u>From Finance & Management</u> – Just a reminder that the office is open for parking permits, payments, work orders, complaints, information, atta boys, financial information, insurance information and anything else that has to do with daily operation of Barrington Park.
