MID SUMMER - It is mid summer at Barrington and things are going pretty well. We are a bit concerned about water as we have been pouring it on trying to get some of the brown spots to green a bit. We have also detected some active colonies of bill bugs that we will be laying down some insect control. By the time you get this letter the summer application of fertilizer and weed control is being applied along with a an insecticide for a grub worm that is eating up some pretty big patches in the lawn. Just as a reminder, when it gets this hot, Mother Nature does it's best to preserve the grass by telling it to go dormant. As soon as it cools a little, it will come back with full glory. So please bear with us a little as we try to strike a balance between water conservation and keeping it lush green. **INSECTS** - Barrington has a policy that we allow nature to take its course concerning most insect control. That is, if they live outside we do nothing. In other words ants, gnats and other insects will often get eaten by other insects or animals. If these pests are invading your home, we suggest you purchase a perimeter spray available at most grocery or hardware stores and spray around your doors and windows. Please be careful with any spray you use as we do have a lot of birds and other animals around the grounds. The County does provide mosquito control for all our ponds and waterways on a regular basis. Owners can assist with mosquito control by insuring no standing water is allowed in containers on porches and patios. Barrington Park will assist "yellow jack" control if they build a nest on the exterior of your home. **PONDS** – We have made numerous calls to state and county agencies trying to come up with some sort of solution to the algae problem we have in our ponds. The frustrating part is that no agency wants to provide any guidance because our water flows into the Jordan River. The only answer they give us is to reduce the nutrients in the water which means trying to control the runoff, leaves, and waterfowl. That's not very likely. We will continue to try to find solutions and make our ponds more attractive at this time of the year. WATERING SCHEDULES - The water comes on at night and in the early morning hours three times a week. Usually (depending on rain and heat) those cycles are about 7 minutes in length three times during the period. This is to allow maximum soaking and avoiding run off. Do not be alarmed if you see an area getting watered more than once in one night. That is part of the plan. As always, residents are encouraged to report any broken sprinklers or heads that do not operate correctly. **POOL** – Thanks so much to all that use the pool. You have been just great this year concerning courtesy and cleanliness. We have had only a couple of very minor incidents and those were taken care of quickly and equitably. In return for your hard efforts, it has been our hard effort to give you the cleanest pool possible. We just under went our inspection by the Health Department. Again, many comments of how great a pool operation Barrington Park operates. Additionally we have received our first water test results done an independent Lab. We have Zero contaminants. Congratulations to you swimmers, the monitors and the maintenance people. For your information, the Pool will close for the season at 9:00 P.M. on the 1st of September. That is Labor Day.

<u>Street Repair</u> – and sealing. This year we are planning on getting the roads repaired and sealed. Here is the latest schedule:

- 15 August All the chuck holes will repaired to include digging out some areas and repaving. There should be little impact on residents other than minor traffic diversions. Please do not park on the streets this day.
- 18 August All roads and waterways will be crack sealed. Crack sealing is where the blow all the dirt out of the cracks and seal them with hot tar. Again there should be little impact on residents. Please do not park on the streets.
- 25 August All carports will be seal coated long with the carport approaches. This will require vehicles not be parked in the carports for 24 hours after coating. Parking will be allowed on the streets and any guest parking areas. As the time comes closer, flyers and notices will be posted. If

residents are planning on being on vacation at that time, they should make arrangements so their vehicles are not left in the carport.

9,10,11 September – All roads in Barrington are scheduled for a "slurry seal". Different sections will be closed and vehicles will not be allowed to drive on those roads for 8 hours. Residents will be given ample notice of the closure areas by the contractor.

We understand the inconvenience this cause residence. However it is a necessary part of the maintenance program and in the long run saves all owners a great deal of money by getting more years of use from our road surfaces. We thank you in advance for you patience during this period.

<u>Best Looking Garden Award</u> – On August 15<sup>th</sup> 2008 a gift Certificate in the amount of \$50.00 will be awarded to the home that has the best looking yard. Many of you do a great deal around you homes to make Barrington look really good. The Board and Grounds Committee think you ought to be recognized for your efforts. Those of you who have not started yet still have some time to get those flower beds going, so get busy and start cleaning and planting.

**From Finance & Management** – When making payments please make sure your address appears somewhere on the check or money order. Your address is your account number and helps insure your payments get posted to the proper account. You do not need to make two separate checks for the special and regular HOA fees, unless you want to for your own accounting purposes. Anything above what your normal HOA fees are will be applied to the special assessment unless you indicate differently. Monies received is first applied to the regular HOA payments and then to the special assessment. Regular HOA fees are due the 1<sup>st</sup> of the month (even if you do not get a statement until sometime later). A Late Charge of \$25.00 can be charge for any payment received after the 20<sup>th</sup> of the month. Homeowners who are at least 90 days in arrears are listed as follows. Others that were on the list have become current. Liens either have or will be placed on these properties if they are not brought current immediately.
