<u>MID SUMMER</u> - By the time you get this letter the summer application of fertilizer and weed control is being applied along with a an insecticide for a grub worm that is eating up some pretty big patches in the lawn. Just as a reminder, when it gets this hot, other Nature does it's best to preserve the grass by telling it to go dormant. As soon as it cools a little, it will come back with full glory. So please bear with us a little as we try to strike a balance between water conservation and keeping it lush green. <u>INSECTS</u> - Barrington

has a policy that we allow nature to take its course concerning most insect control. That is, if they live outside we do nothing. In other words ants, gnats and other insects will often get eaten by other insects or animals. If these pests are invading your home, we suggest you purchase a perimeter spray available at most grocery or hardware stores and spray around your doors and windows. Please be careful with any spray you use as we do have a lot of birds and other animals around the grounds. The County does provide mosquito control for all our ponds and waterways on a regular basis. Owners can assist with mosquito control by insuring no standing water is allowed in containers on porches and patios. Barrington Park will assist "yellow jack" control if they build a nest on the exterior of your home. PONDS - We have made numerous calls to state and county agencies trying to come up with some sort of solution to the algae problem we have in our ponds. The frustrating part is that no agency wants to provide any definitive guidance because our water flows into the Jordan River. We are getting closer as the Division of Wildlife Resources has made some suggestions that we are looking at. Hopefully in the near future we get something done. WATERING SCHEDULES - The water comes on at night and in the early morning hours three times a week. Usually (depending on rain and heat) those cycles are about 7 minutes in length three times during the period. This is to allow maximum soaking and avoiding run off. Do not be alarmed if you see an area getting watered more than once in one night. That is part of the plan. As always, residents are encouraged to report any broken sprinklers or heads that do not operate correctly. **POOL** – Thanks so much to all that use the pool. You have been just great this year concerning courtesy and cleanliness. In return for your hard efforts, it has been our hard effort to give you the cleanest pool possible. As you know the pool underwent major renovation and is one of the best in the city. We have had to learn how to deal with the new isolated Wading Pool but think we have it all figured out. Again, we receive many comments of how great a pool operation Barrington Park operates. Congratulations to you swimmers, the monitors and the maintenance people. For your information, the Pool will close for the season at 9:00 P.M. on the 7th of September. That is Labor Day.

<u>Parking on the Streets</u> – **WARNING** – Starting August 10, 2009, Dealership Towing will begin patrolling the streets of Barrington Park at random times between 12:00 Midnight and 6:00 AM. Any car left on the streets will be towed at owner's expense. We have been forced into taking these measures due to the numerous cars that have disregarded the rule of no parking on the streets overnight.

<u>Best Looking Garden Award</u> — On August 22 2009, Gift Certificates in the amounts of \$25.00, \$50.00 and \$75.00 will be awarded to the homes that have the best looking yard. Many of you do a great deal around you homes to make Barrington look really good. The Board and Grounds Committee think you ought to be recognized for your efforts. From Finance & Management – When making payments please make sure your address appears somewhere on the check or money order. Your address is your account number and helps insure your payments get posted to the proper account. You do not need to make two separate checks for the special and regular HOA fees, unless you want to for your own accounting purposes. Anything above what your normal HOA fees are will be applied to the special assessment unless you indicate differently. Monies received is first applied to the regular HOA payments and then to the special assessment. Regular HOA fees are due the 1st of the month (even if you do not get a statement until sometime later). A Late Charge of \$25.00 can be charge for any payment received after the 20th of the month. Homeowners who are at least 90 days in arrears are listed as follows. Others that were on the list have become current. Liens either have or will be placed on these properties if they are not brought current immediately.

July 2009 Park Report

Job Order Status: 124 new Requests, 94 Closed, 204 Still Open – an increase of 30 requests (counter 6023) Of the 204 still open, 31 are "Unfunded" of which most are cement.

Grounds - & Buildings

- Continued work on backlog work orders.
- Mowing on a weekly basis, Raised height to summer cut (3").
- Adjustments being made to sprinkler system.
- Pool operations going well. One minor incident with guest and alcohol.
- Pool Heater required major maintenance overhaul (soot buildup due to poor ventilation).
- Under driveway water line break. Maintenance was able to pull new pipe without calling in an auger.
- 1 tree on Norwalk was blow over by wind. Many trees had minor damage. All limbs in ground have been cleaned up. Still cleaning up in the trees a branches are identified.
- 3 Dead trees were removed and all stumps will be removed within the next two weeks.
- Still having issues with pond Maintenance. Solutions range from fish to chemicals. Have had limited success in getting answers from State Division of Wildlife. Looking for a licensed water pesticide manager.
- Trimming of bushes is on going.
- Deck staining complete for this year..
- Emergency roof replacement on 1236/40 Norwalk complete.
- 8 more pallets (288 5 Gal pails) of Rhino Coatings ordered and on the way. 144 buckets of Primer and 144 buckets of White base. Should be enough to get us through this season.

- Completed three buildings on coating renovations. Approximately 5 weeks behind on painting from last year due to weather delays.
- Painter out due ankle injury has returned. Will keep both painters on as long as funding will last or we catch up from weather delays.
