BOARD OF DIRECTOR BUSINESS- We are pleased to announce that you homeowners have approved the change to the Barrington Park Bylaws. This change reduced the number of required owners to constitute a quorum at the annual or special meetings of the membership. The change reduces the number at the second called meeting from a required 20% to 5%. This change in no way reduces owner's ability or right to vote. It does allow that those owners making the effort to come to meetings and participate in the community government are able to be recognized and counted. We thank those of you that voted for the amendment and particularly our CC&R Committee chaired by Deloris Lenhart for the amount of time and effort—they volunteered to make this change happen. Once the document is recorded at the County Recorder's Office, it will be posted on the website www.barringtonparkhoa.com.

<u>Pool Opening</u> – Mark your calendars that on Saturday May 23rd (Memorial Day Weekend), the Barrington Park Swimming pool is scheduled to open for the season (weather permitting). We take a lot of pride in the cleanliness of our pool water and do much to make sure that you have a great experience with your family and guests. You residents and your guest have also done a wonderful job in keeping our pool clean and enjoyable. This year we are going to try adding a couple more hours for your enjoyment. The pool will remain open until 10:00 PM on Friday and Saturday nights. So the new hours of the pool will be:

11:00 AM - 9:00 PM Monday thru Thursday 11:00 AM - 10:00 PM Friday 10:00 AM - 10:00 PM Saturday 10:00 AM - 9:00 PM Sunday

As a couple of reminders: You must be current on your HOA monthly maintenance assessment to use the pool. Bring your ID. Homeowners must be at the pool with guests at all times. No alcoholic beverages or persons who appear to be intoxicated are allowed.

12th Annual Barrington Park Garage Sale. The dates of May 16th and 17th are set for the Annual Barrington Park Garage Sale. Get all that unwanted stuff out of your basement and closets and make a few bucks in the process. Each year, we have a lot of traffic coming through the park (especially on Saturday). Water and Sprinklers – We hear that the snow pack is way below average this year and don't feel good about the water situation. We continue to hear rumors about water rationing, but have not seen any actual directives other than asking us all to do all we can to conserve. We will continue to conserve and watch our systems to reduce costs as much as possible as each day the water is on it costs the Association about \$175.00. The main sprinkler water lines are charged with sprinkler repairs and adjustments being made as this is being written. We will start limited watering as the weather dictates. Owners can help by observing and reporting any sprinklers that are not operating properly or are broken. Flags will be available in a container by the office door. If owners flag a bad sprinkler, maintenance will automatically go fix it. Help us conserve and save water while keeping Barrington Park green and beautiful.

<u>Spring Cleanup -</u> It is now SPRING and in order to keep Barrington Park looking Beautiful and well kept it is time for you to do your part by getting your areas spruced up. Remove the dead leaves and flowers, pull the weeds and clean the oil spots on the driveways. Remember it is your responsibility that all weeds and debris be removed from under your decks and patios, these are not storage areas Thank You for your help in keeping Barrington Park a beautiful place to live.

<u>Suggestions for Cleaning Up Oil Stains -</u> Many have received letters concerning oil stains on driveways. It may sound like a stupid to be concerned about but really it isn't. Not only is the oil unsightly, but it gets into our waterway system (ponds and streams). Many have asked how to get the oil cleaned so here are some suggestions:

- 1. Absorb fresh oil spots with rags, paper towels or cat litter, or use a powder laundry soap mixed with fine sand, scrub the area with a stiff brush let this set for awhile then sweep up.
- 2. Make a paste of automatic dish soap or any laundry soap (liquid or powder) with small amount of water scrub into the area let this set for a few hours then hose down, repeat if needed.
- 3. Mix any Liquid soap with water in a spray bottle, spray the spots and scrub into the cement let this set for awhile, and then hose down, repeat if needed
- 4. You can also try any cola product, Baking Soda or TSP (tri-sodium phosphate).
- 5. Valspar Concrete Stain & Spot Remover is also good, (\$12.95 at Lowe's).

You can purchase an oil drip pan that you can put under the vehicle (Wal-Mart has these for about \$13.00) or they have them at auto parts stores, <u>This will need to be removed and put somewhere out of sight when the car is not in the driveway, this pan will also need to be kept clean</u>.

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<u>AUTOMATIC PAYMENT is alive and well</u> - In July 2 years ago, we started automatic withdrawal of HOA fees. All we can say is that it has been a resounding success As of this month we have 123 owners who have signed up. They no longer wonder if they forgot to make a payment. They don't have to write

checks anymore. They know that they will always be on time and never be charged a late fee. They know their payment never gets lost in the mail or a drop box. They simply don't worry about HOA fees anymore. Automatic Payments are actually more reliable than most peoples bill pay systems. Many bill pay checks are received in the office well after the check date. in cases where those are received after the 15th, late charges apply.

Once you are signed up for Automatic Payments, there is nothing else you need to do until you no longer want to participate. Then it takes notice to the office that you wish us to stop. Every month, on approximately the same date, your HOA fees will be transferred from your bank account to your account here at Barrington Park. Your Barrington Park account is updated and your statements will reflect the posting. That simple. Automatic Payment is simple, safe, and worry free. From Finance & Management – When making payments please make sure your address appears somewhere on the check or money order. Your address is your account number and helps insure your payments get posted to the proper account. HOA fees are due the 1st of the month (even if you do not get a statement until sometime later). A Late Charge of \$25.00 or 5%, whichever is greater, WILL be charged for any payment received after the 15th of the month. Homeowners who were at least 2 months in arrears as of the 15th of last month are listed as follows. Others that were on the list have become current. Liens either have or will be placed on these properties if they are not brought current immediately.
