The Board of Directors knows that you residents make this community what it is. It is you that keeps it safe, clean, and well maintained. It is the little things that you do like watching out for your neighbor, picking up that little piece of trash, pulling and extra weed and planting those beautiful flowers that makes Barrington Park stand out from the crowd. POOL – The pool will close for this summer at the end of Labor Day (9:00 PM). Thanks so much to all that used the pool. You have been just great this year concerning courtesy and cleanliness. We hope that you found your pool experience fun and enjoyable. It is one of the best maintained and attractive pools in the valley. We also want to thank the pool monitors for their help in keeping the pool area a great place to visit. See you next year for the Memorial Day weekend opening.

LOTS OF CONCRETE- The contractor has been picked for the concrete replacement and we are hoping that he can begin shortly. We know it is messy and inconvenient but "Oh! What a difference" when it's done. All this work is a result of the funds that you owners approved a few years ago. We are doing the worst first so if you have not got your bad cement replaced yet, be assured that we have plans to do more each year as monies become available from our budgeting process. In other words, you can expect to see continued work of this nature every year. You will eventually get done.

<u>Best Looking Garden Award</u> – The Jury is still out. Look for results in the next newsletter. We simply did not have enough time for the judges to get their votes compiled and the fact that so many of you have really good looking garden areas. It's really sad to think that the first frost is only a few weeks away and that our lovely flowers will start to get ready for winter. Enjoy the surrounding while the flowers are still brilliant.

<u>Parking on the Streets</u> – When concrete replacement begins, the parking on the street restrictions will eased a bit. However, please use common sense in parking on the street. Don't park behind someone's driveway blocking them from getting in or out. Don't park in such a way as to restrict say a fire truck or

ambulance from being able to get down the street. We know it's inconvenient, but suggest that you park in the guest parking spots for a while.

<u>Rules Reminder</u> – Trash Containers - Residents are to place containers on the street for collection <u>no earlier</u> than the <u>evening before</u> scheduled pickup and are to remove the containers from the street <u>no later than the evening of pickup</u>. Trash containers must be kept in the garage or next to the fence for units with carports.

<u>Pet Rules Correction -</u> In last month newsletter we published the rules and interpretation of those rules as written in the CC&Rs. They are still valid except for two minor changes. We published "Pets must be on a leash at all times, with a human attached to one end whenever the pet is on common or limited common area.) Paragraph 9 of Article III of the CC&Rs actually states:

D) While in the Common Area, all animals MUST BE ON A LEASH OR RESTRAINED AT ALL TIMES and under the control of a responsible person. Animals are not allowed to roam in Barrington Park. When a pet defecates on any portion of the Common Area or Limited Common Area, the Owner/Resident shall immediately remove the feces. If an Owner or Resident fails to comply with this provision, the Board of Directors may bar such animals from the Common Area. Fines for noncompliance shall also be imposed in accordance with the Association's schedule of fines created by the Board of Directors.

The interpretation now is that a pet could be staked out as long as the owner is close enough for immediate observation and control. We also published "Owners are allowed only two pets and the combined weight is not to exceed 75lbs." Paragraph 9 of Article III of the CC&Rs actually states:

A) Homeowners will be allowed to have two (2) animals.

There is no weight limit on the two (2) animals an owner can have. Sorry for any confusion that may have been created. The rules may seem too restrictive to some and not restrictive enough for others. We do try to strike a balance. We just want all the pet owners to be responsible and realize that not everyone enjoys or cares for your pet. We also want non pet owners to remember that some people feel very deeply about their pets and that they add a great deal to their wellbeing. With both kinds of people, a reminder to respect your neighbor and be tolerate of differences.

<u>Feeding the Wildlife</u> – Residents are reminded and encouraged <u>not</u> to feed the wildlife around the Park especially the ducks. Although it may be fun to mingle with nature, it creates a false environment for the animals which in turn causes them stress which can be fatal when the feeding stops. It also encourages other animals such as predators to take up residency here. Leaving pet food outside is a bad idea. Pet food will attract skunks, raccoons and fox, all of which have been seen around Barrington. This year we have seen a big increase in the number of squirrels which are trying to take up residence under decks and porches and patios. They are eating about anything they can find and seem to love peoples gardens and bird feeders. All we can do is try to trap them which has had little success. We also paid dearly to have a skunk removed. We do love our wildlife but please allow nature to keep it in balance.

<u>A Little Note About Security</u> - Good neighbors look out for each other. If you are away for awhile and your neighbor knows about it, he or she can keep an eye on your place. Then, if they see anything out of the ordinary, they can alert the police. They might also let you know if you left your car unlocked or noticed other things that might help keep you and your property safe. Barrington Park has little reported crime. The ones we do hear about are usually those where a garage door was left open, or expensive valuable items were plainly visible in a car and the door unlocked. Help yourself and your neighbors from becoming victims. Watch out for yourself and others.
