Pest Control –We have had several people ask again about spraying for bugs, slugs, earwigs, ants and other insects. As policy, Barrington Park does not use pesticides of any kind other than wasp freeze that is sprayed directly at an active wasp nest on the buildings and trees. Gopher pellets are also used on rare occasion and are buried directly into gopher tunnels and mounds. This policy has been in effect for many years to avoid our wildlife and pets from consuming pesticides or insecticides. We do know that owners use different insecticides or pesticides for various reasons. However, owners should not use any chemicals on any of the common areas. Owners are responsible for misuse or unauthorized use of pesticides.

Big Projects -- Soon we will begin doing more concrete replacement. Each year we have been alternating between patios and driveways. This year we will be doing a bit of both as we address problems that are more urgent than some others. You have probably noticed that we have also done a great deal of cement "lifting". This saves the HOA a great deal of money. By lifting we do not have to replace the concrete and it brings it back to level. Still on the schedule for this year is a renovation and repair of the tennis courts. This was supposed to take place at the end of July but we have had some problems with the contractor's schedule. We will keep you informed when we finally get the dates. We again have to thank you homeowners for supporting the funding of the necessary and worthwhile projects. Keeping the community in good repair not only makes this a wonderful place to live, but it also helps maintain and increase the value of our properties. When we do these larger projects we know it will cause some inconvenience for a few days. We will try to keep the disturbance as minimal as possible.

<u>Swimming Pool</u> – Just a reminder that the pool will be closing for the season at 9:00 PM, September 5, 2016, which is the end of the Labor Day Holiday. Even though it has been a busy year at the pool, there has not been a single "contamination incident" where we have had to close the pool. YEAH !!! We thank all swimmers and ask you to please continue to be kind to your fellow residents by monitoring your children

closely and see that they use the restrooms on a regular basis while at the pool. Thanks to all of you who use the pool, obey the rules, are courteous to other bathers and respect the facilities.

<u>Carports –</u> Owners who have carports are reminded of few items and rules. 1st You and your guests are to park only in your own carport unless you are given specific approval of the owner of another carport owner to park in theirs. 2nd Carports are to be used for vehicles only. They are not to be used to store furniture, appliances, or anything other than vehicles. 3rd Only garbage cans can be placed outside the patios and under the carports. 4th Carports are not to be used for vehicle repairs and servicing.

<u>Best Looking Garden Awards</u> – The time is almost here for Judging and it is going to be hard. There are a lot of good looking garden areas. The Board of Directors, Grounds Committee and Property Manger (DFI) think you ought to be recognized for your efforts. <u>**Fun little tidbit of useful information**</u> - Common Household Product is Magic Most of us already know that a teaspoon of baking soda in the batter will make the muffins rise, but who knew that a pinch of it mixed with scrambled eggs will make them fluffier or added to water will make steamed vegetables stay green?

Aside from cooking, however, everyone knows that an open box of baking soda in the fridge will absorb strong odors. But did you also know that baking soda in the bath water can relieve itchy skin caused by bug bites or poison ivy? And that pouring a cup of baking soda followed by a cup of hot vinegar down a stopped up drain will unclog it? Baking soda also can be used to polish tarnished silver, remove rust stains, extinguish a grease fire, freshen toothbrushes and clean dishwashers and coffee makers. Add it to kitty litter and the laundry to help freshen and deodorize. Sprinkle baking soda on a wet sponge to scrub residue off a cast-iron skillet. Or use it on sidewalk and driveway cracks as a non-toxic weed killer. A dusting of it around pet food bowls will keep ants away too.

A couple of cautions about baking soda, though: Its magic powers fade with time, so check the expiration date on the box. Most important, don't mix it with other cleaning products. The chemical reaction could be toxic.

From Finance & Management – When making payments please make sure your address appears somewhere on the check or money order. Your address is your account number and helps insure your payments get posted to the proper account. HOA fees are due the 1st of the month (even if you do not get a statement until sometime later). <u>A</u> Late Charge of \$25.00 or 5%, whichever is greater, WILL be charged for any payment received after the 15th of the month. Homeowners who were at least 2 months in arrears as of the 15th of last month are listed as follows. Others that were on the list have become current. Liens either have or will be placed on these properties if they are not brought current immediately.
