TENNIS COURTS – They are done!!! After years and years of major damage, the tennis courts have been repaired and resurfaced. They are a beautiful... and functional. There has been much debate over the years as what to do with the old courts. It was almost the same story as "What comes first? The chicken or the egg?' Many folks said "Don't put any money into repairs because no one uses them." The ones that wanted to use them said they wouldn't because "They are were unsafe and not useable with big cracks in them". Because the tennis courts were and is an amenity when we owners bought into Barrington Park, the HOA really has had an obligation to keep them useable and maintained. Thus the decision, which is really an obligation, was to repair. Because the courts are common area and owned equally by all owners in Barrington Park, the only way to change the originally intended purpose of that common area is to get the same number of homeowners that can change the CC&Rs to agree to some other change. The result then is that Barrington Park has repaired and refurbished tennis courts. BUT THAT'S NOT ALL. The tennis courts have also been marked to be "Pickle Ball" courts. At first the Board didn't know what pickle ball was but it is the latest court craze taking the country by storm. Apparently its loads of fun, less strenuous than tennis but a great way to exercise and have fun. When we asked the contractor doing the courts if he would put pickle ball on one court, he said no. He said we want to do both courts because once people start playing it, it will catch on like wildfire. So.... we did both courts. Take a look on the internet, it really does look fun. We have already had a few people use the courts for pickle ball and it appears to be catching on.

<u>POOL</u> – The pool will close for this summer at the end of Labor Day (9:00 PM). Thanks so much to all that used the pool. You have been just great this year concerning courtesy and cleanliness. We made it through the entire year with a single "accident" which would have caused a pool closure. GREAT!! We hope that you found your pool experience fun and enjoyable. It is one of the best maintained and attractive pools in the valley. We also want to thank the pool monitors for their help in keeping the pool area a great place to visit. LOTS OF CONCRETE- The contractor has started concrete replacement. We know it is messy and inconvenient but "Oh! What a difference" when it's done. All this work is a result of the funds that you owners approved a few years ago. We are doing the worst first so if you have not got your bad cement replaced yet, be assured that we have plans to do more each year as we budget cement replacement in our budgeting process. In other words, you can expect to see continued work of this nature every year. If you have cement that ought to be replaced, it will eventually get done.

<u>Parking on the Streets</u> – With concrete replacement beginning, parking on the street restrictions will be eased a bit. However, please use common sense in parking on the street. Don't park behind someone's driveway blocking them from getting in or out. Don't park in such a way as to restrict say a fire truck or ambulance from being able to get down the street. If you are one of the people having work done, we know it's inconvenient, but suggest that you park in the guest parking spots for a while.

Best Looking Garden Award – The Judges are finalizing their pick for the best looking gardens. Look for results in the next newsletter. We simply did not have enough time for the judges to get their votes compiled and the fact that so many of you have really good looking garden areas. It's really sad to think that the first frost is only a few weeks away and that our lovely flowers will start to get ready for winter. Enjoy the surrounding while the flowers are still brilliant.

<u>**Rules Reminders**</u> – Trash Containers - Residents are to place containers on the street for collection <u>no earlier</u> than the evening before scheduled pickup, and are to remove the containers from the street <u>no later than the</u> evening of pickup. Trash containers must be kept in the garage or next to the fence for units with carports.

Driveways... Vehicle leaks are the responsibility of the homeowner to properly clean up. An oil drip pan must be used; this needs be kept clean and out of sight when the vehicle is not in the driveway.

Feeding the Wildlife – Residents are reminded and encouraged **not** to feed the wildlife around the Park especially the ducks. Although it may be fun to mingle with nature, it creates a false environment for the animals which in turn causes them stress which can be fatal when the feeding stops. It also encourages other animals such as predators to take up residency here. Leaving pet food outside is a bad idea. Pet food will attract skunks, raccoons and fox, all of which have been seen around Barrington. This year we have seen a big increase in the number of squirrels which are trying to take up residence under decks and porches and patios. They are eating about anything they can find and seem to love people's gardens and bird feeders. All we can do is try to trap them which has had little success. We also paid dearly to have a skunk removed. We do love our wildlife but please allow nature to keep it in balance.

<u>A Little Note About Security</u> - Good neighbors look out for each other. If you are away for awhile and your neighbor knows about it, he or she can keep an eye on your place. Then, if they see anything out of the ordinary, they can alert the police. They might also let you know if you left your car unlocked or noticed other things that might help keep you and your property safe. Barrington Park has little reported crime. The ones we do hear about are usually those where a garage door was left open, or expensive valuable items were plainly visible in a car and the door unlocked. Help yourself and your neighbors from becoming victims. Watch out for yourself and others.
